The American breakout horror hit has a few things going for it. Key reasons: It ditches the found-footage trope, minimises cheap jump scares and sustains a mood of almost unbearable creepiness for its entire running time. Teenager Jay (Maika Monroe, right) is an average suburban girl but things take a turn for the horrific when she discovers that her first sexual experience has given her more than just a memory.

She inherits a wraith. slow-moving but relentless, shuffling towards her at all hours of the day and night, with her murder as its purpose.

The curse comes with a set of rules that places her and her friends in a terrible moral conundrum.
